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SINCE 1948

The origins of the Foundation go back to 1948, when Carmen Pardo-Valcarce acknowledged the petitions of individuals stricken with leprosy, who were living in the Trillo Leper Colony in Guadalajara. They asked her to help their children grow up and be educated in a leprosy-free environment.

So she decided to donate an estate that she owned in what is now the district of Montecarmelo to establish the Foundation. She began work on the building that accommodates us today, which in those days housed thousands of boys and girls, the healthy children of the sick lepers.

Rosario Cavestany, one of her daughters, continued

on with her mother's work with the preventorium as she saw how leprosy was eradicated in Spain and she passed on the tradition to her daughter Carmen.


Carmen Cafranga Cavestany, the granddaughter of the founder was quick to realise that if her grandmother and her mother had dedicated themselves to children and young people faced with social upheaval, she had to continue on with their work and so she committed herself to helping people with intellectual disabilities integrate into society.

In memory of her grandmother she set up the Fundación Carmen Pardo-Valcarce, which, in just a few years, became a reference point throughout the world in its sphere of activity.

Almudena Martorell Cafranga, the daughter of Carmen, is the current President of the Foundation.

Her commitment and extensive training in the field guarantee that the work of her great-grandmother, which started more than half a century ago, continues to prosper now under the name of the Fundación A.I.A.PAR.

We are proud to say that we train hundreds of people with intellectual disabilities every year.



SPECIAL EDUCATION SCHOOL

The school is subsidized by the Board of Education of the Community of Madrid.

We strive to get our 182 students promote their intellectual capacity to the full, by arousing their interest in learning and communicating, so that they improve in the instrumental areas, in their capacity to understand and express themselves, in analysis and in the workshop activities.

But our main objective when it comes to our students goes beyond instrumental learning. We think it is essential to favour the highest level of personal development possible. We want them to improve their social skills. Favouring their adaptive behaviour helps them be more INDEPENDENT in all areas.

That is why we encourage situations that promote forming proper relationships, by working on the necessary social and job skills to attain a higher grade of independence and integration into the job market and society.

Moreover, we try and make the values of our ideology theirs and we focus on enhancing physical, psychological and spiritual development, raising the awareness of others' needs, promoting mutual respect and active participation in society, etc.

FOR STUDENTS AGED **BETWEEN 12 AND** 16 YEARS OLD

Basic Compulsory Education

In Basic Compulsory Education we want our students to carry on developing their skills in school subjects and acquire more domestic, social and pre-employment skills that are suitable for their age group.



Special Vocational Educational Programmes:

- Support operations in general and administrative services
- Support operations in setting-up and the maintenance of microcomputer systems
- Basic cooking operations



FOR STUDENTS AGED **BETWEEN 16 AND** 21 YEARS OLD

Training programmes for the Transition to Adulthood:

- Bakery and business activities
- Building alterations and maintenance activities
- Gardening and DIY activities

The school also has other services and activities: school canteen, speech therapy, psychology, social assistance, psychiatry, nursing, computer skills, music therapy and training at job centres, a sports Club, an exchange programme with a Scottish school, job coaching, excursion programmes and hostels and in collaboration with Fundaland and the Sports Club: afternoon activities and sports schools.





CAMPVS

CAMPVS was set up to train young people with intellectual disabilities, who have completed their formal education and want to go on to higher education and acquire better personal, social, and professional skills.

We are distinguished for educational excellence and the comprehensive development of students who are the focus point of the venture, and who are supported by their families as a natural and social unit. The company and the professionals are the agents of education and the promoters of opportunity.

We educate by creating community projects that incorporate the latest trends, and they are highly valuable educationally speaking from a creative and innovative viewpoint.

We work hard so that everyone can get a job by meeting the needs of the individual, society and the corporate world

The project includes numerous programs, networks, support resources, technological tools, and experienced professionals who are capable of preparing the 96 students to research into, create, and fulfil their own life project.

Additional services

OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY CENTRE

The A LA PAR (formerly known as the Pardo-Valcarce) Occupational Therapy Centre was established in 1991. It is a place where young people with intellectual disabilities can receive training and progress towards a more-than-likely job placement. Initially, it was only for students who were completing their studies at our special education school, but later it was opened up to any young person with intellectual disabilities who needed it

Since the 1st of March, 2002 the Centre has been subsidized by the Community of Madrid, and accordingly it has been run pursuant to the laws of this Community. Currently there are 136 subsidized places plus 20 private ones. The training available is adapted to the interests and needs of each of the students, who acquire the skills and the working pace required to work in an ordinary company.

To attain these objectives, the centre has:

- Incentives: A fixed monthly "allowance" for each user, which can be increased for excellent attendance, punctuality, work, camaraderie, and compliance with standards. The tokens of this in-house economic system are called "Fuencarrales".
- Employment Office and Special Job Centres: When a user has acquired the aforesaid the skills and pace of work, the next step is to find them a job, either in a Special Employment Centre or in an ordinary company.
- Meetings: Every Friday the monitors and users of each workshop meet to discuss the weekly events and try to resolve any possible problems.
- Personal development groups: According to their needs, the users of the Occupational Therapy Centre work in groups on different skills so that they can become more independent and have a better quality of life: these include managing money, transportation, new technologies, self-control...
- Representatives' meeting: Every three months, the representatives chosen by the users of each workshop get together to come up with ways to improve and increase satisfaction.
- Psychosocial area: Users and their families are given assistance to develop and attain life goals through a personalised plan.



RESEARCH AND VOCATIONAL TRAINING

RESEARCH

The approach of the Fundación A LA PAR to promote the integration of people with intellectual disabilities in society focuses on researching into areas that affect the mental health, employment and the quality of life of people with intellectual disabilities.

However, the objective of this research work is not only to acquire knowledge, but also to obtain useful results that can be put into practice, provide users with better services and help get people with intellectual disabilities more involved.

TRAINING

Moreover the Foundation has been sharing work-related experiences acquired from the different services available for more than 10 years. These areas, which are used to exchange know-how and experiences, are brought together through training organised by the Foundation for all the professionals who work directly or indirectly with people with intellectual disabilities.

The training provided by the Foundation is intended to teach participants about the concepts and tools needed to help people with intellectual disabilities and enable their families overcome barriers throughout the different stages of their life. In the last 10 years we have trained over 2000 professionals through our training schemes.





INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION

The Cooperation Department of the Fundación A LA PAR was set up in 2001 to defend the rights of people with intellectual disabilities in Latin America.

The Cooperation Department has carried out projects funded by the Community of Madrid and the European Union to work in Central America, and in Madrid (Education for Development and Solidarity) to defend the rights of people with intellectual disabilities and help them by means of the necessary resources to be aware of the mechanisms available so that they can assert their rights.

In Latin America the lines of work of our projects are:

- Training teachers and professionals who work in organizations and care for people with intellectual disabilities.
- Training educational consultants and inspectors of the Schools of the Ministry of Education, who are in charge of helping and supervising centres that lack working knowledge in the area of special educational needs.
- Raising the awareness of the business sector to help people with intellectual disabilities gain access to the job market.
- Training those at the head offices of the Human Rights Procurator on how to put the International Convention on the Rights of People with Disabilities into practice.
- Consolidating networks of organizations that provide assistance to people with intellectual disabilities.
- Improving the training, guidance and counselling for relatives of people with intellectual disabilities.
- Training groups of young people with intellectual disabilities so that they are aware of their rights, the mechanisms available to defend them so that in turn they can then teach other people about their rights.

INTERNATIONAL VOLUNTEER WORK

The workers of the Fundación A LA PAR can also help out with the centres that usually work in Latin America in the summer. These are educational and occupational therapy centres where they can use all the experience acquired from the Foundation and learn how work is done there with much fewer resources. The work of the Foundation in Spain and abroad is enriched and united little by little thanks to these volunteers.

INDEPENDNT LIFE PROJECT LEISURE CLUB FAMILY SCHOOL SPORTS CLUB

39 people are living by themselves, independently and becoming bolder. A few brave revolutionaries who are breaking ground and dare we say it, they will make history...



INDEPENDENT LIFE AND LEISURE

INDEPENDENT LIFE PROJECT:

The objective of this initiative is to make the transition to an independent life easier for people with intellectual disabilities. To this end, we prepare the preliminary step that involves living in a training residence where they learn the necessary skills to become independent in the future.

Having completed this stage at a training house, they are given the necessary support to become independent in a home that they share with friends and where they are supervised by a professional from the Foundation.





Launched in 2013, the training house is a place to learn how to live independently. People with intellectual disabilities are given training on all the skills required to live independently. As training, we provide them with real-life experiences like sleeping and living away from home. 36 people use this house annually.

SUPERVISED RESIDENCE

In July of 2011, four co-workers from the Special Employment Centre began a new life in our first supervised residence, granted by the IVIMA of Madrid [housing institute]. This was a giant step towards giving independence to people with intellectual disabilities.

Today there are 3 residences and we hope to open more in the near future so that they can be enjoyed by many of the users of our training house.

3 SHELTERED HOUSING

If someone with intellectual disabilities wants to live more independently away from the family environment or they lose their next of kin, they get access to sheltered housing. It's a model that gets residents familiar with ordinary life, they are provided with comprehensive care that includes lodging; their upkeep; assistance to carry out daily life activities; personal, family, and social support; leisure and free time activities.









INDEPENDENT LIFE AND LEISURE

FAMILY SCHOOL

This activity started 20 years ago and it involves working in a group with the families to discuss their concerns, educational or information models related to the disability. It is also a place to share experiences and learn from others.

The main objective is to provide information about the life project, support it for the users/workers and improve family life.

The family school meets up two Thursdays a month in the afternoon.



LEISURE CLUB

Having fun is the main objective of the Leisure Club.

People with intellectual disabilities need leisure time away from their family and work to be with friends and make plans that are appropriate for their own age group, which sometimes they are unable to do due to the nature of their disability.

Two Saturdays a month, employees of the Occupational Therapy Centre and the Special Employment Centre forget about their work and training to take part in incredible activities: a meal at Patones, a visit to the zoo, an evening at the theatre, a fun night out, which are just a few of our pastimes, but there are many more to come!





INDEPENDENT LIFE AND LEISURE

SPORTS CLUB

WHO SAID THAT INTELLECTUAL DISABILITY AND SPORT WERE INCOMPATIBLE?

They are not incompatible; they complement each other 100%. Proof of this is the outstanding participation and the success of the sports Club. Since 2002, more than 500 people with intellectual disabilities have taken part in our sports programme and they have enjoyed their rewards: GOLD medals in the latest World and European Outdoor and Indoor Athletics Championships, in the Special Olympics World and European Games and the National Championships in different sports such as golf, basketball, swimming, athletics, indoor football, etc... and also for our Club. It has been voted the best club of the Community of Madrid and one of the best in Spain since 2005. In the last few years it has been ranked as being the number 1 National Club of the Spanish Sports Federation for people with Intellectual Disabilities.

But we are not satisfied with that, we want more!



We take part in 19 types of sport and we have world elite athletes from the Paralympic world, such as Dionibel Rodríguez, Fernando Batista and Deliber Rodríguez, members of the Spanish Athletics Team who have won the World Outdoor and Indoor Athletics Championship title in individual events and relays on more than one occasion. Their success enables them to benefit from different Paralympic Target Sport Support Plan Grants (ADOP Plan). Their dream came true in the Paralympic Games of Río de Janeiro 2016 and they have also won two Olympic diplomas.

THERAPEUTIC ACCOMPANIMENT

DAY CENTRE [DIEM] ASSISTANCE UNIT FOR VICTIMS OF INTELLECTUAL DISABILITIES [UAVDI]

We are pioneers when it comes to looking after people with mild intellectual or cognitive disabilities who have mental health problems, in particular behavioural disorders.

And also in caring for victims of abuse who have intellectual disabilities.



THERAPEUTIC ACCOMPANIMENT

DAY CENTRE [DIEM]

BEHAVIOURAL DISORDERS AND MENTAL HEALTH

This pioneering centre has been set up to help people with mild intellectual or cognitive disabilities who have mental health problems, in particular behavioural disorders. We focus on making sure that the people we help gain more independence and improve their quality of life.



On average we see 20 individuals aged between 18 and 40, from 9.00 to 16.00, over a maximum period of 2 years.

Our objectives are as follows:

- To promote the recovery and/or acquisition of numerous abilities, personal and social skills needed to be part of the community.
- Prevent the risk of decompensation by reducing the symptoms.
- Provide the primary care centres with the tools needed to assess and help people with intellectual disabilities, sharing the experiences gained so far, which can be used as an operating model.
- We provide the families with support, advice and training so that it is easier for them to acquire the skills and the abilities to improve life together.
- Promote a multidisciplinary, communicative and low-stress work environment.

The activities are organised by eight professionals for the users, their relatives and other members of the community who are involved:

- On-site and phone coordination with different disability and healthcare network units.
- Individual therapy sessions with the user.
- Family sessions and Family School.
- Workshops and therapy groups.
- Emergency assistance.
- Home visits (if the situation so requires).
- Group excursions outside the Centre, both leisure and cultural excursions.
- Work experience in the A LA PAR Occupational Therapy Centre.





THERAPEUTIC ACCOMPANIMENT

ASSISTANCE UNIT FOR VICTIMS OF INTELLECTUAL DISABILITIES [UAVDI]

Given the helplessness felt by people with Intellectual Disabilities when they are abused and as there are no specialised assistance services for victims of abuse who have intellectual disabilities, in 2010 the Fundación A LA PAR set up the Assistance Unit for Victims of Intellectual Disabilities (UAVDI) and started its NO+ABUSE project with the help and collaboration of the Guardia Civil.

The three main lines of action of the UAVDI are:

The three main lines of action of the UAVDI are:

INVOLVEMENT

With people with intellectual disabilities who have been victims of sexual abuse or mistreatment, with their families and the referring professionals.

- Evaluation of the case forensic and clinical.
- Individual, family, and group psychotherapy.
- Facilitator service, whose job is to guarantee that the victim has access to justice in terms of equality.
- Legal assistance, providing the person with intellectual disabilities with our knowledge and experience.

RESEARCH

This is the backbone of the project, which is intended to adapt the necessary forensic tools, law enforcement, judicial procedures and therapeutic instruments when working with victims of ID. Based on the research carried out, the first law enforcement guide for professionals from the world of ID has been written on how to deal with sexual abuse and domestic violence.

PREVENTION AND RAISING AWARENESS

We are working to create spaces (onsite and online) to raise awareness and promote training for all the professionals who work either directly or indirectly with people who have ID.

EMPLOYMENT OFFICE SHELTERED EMPLOYMENT

126 workers with intellectual disabilities among our personnel, who do their best and value their work. A fine example every day!

More than 60 job placements in the company, which goes to show that having a diversity of staff not only makes the world a better place but it also creates a more valuable and competitive company.



EMPLOYMENT OFFICE

Since 2005, our work at the Employment Office has been inspired by a philosophy based on two fundamental principles: firstly to get people with intellectual disabilities involved in society and the world of work and secondly make sure that people with disabilities can live life to the full, if we can give them effective support to achieve this.

To this end, our first objective is to make people with intellectual disabilities more employable and give them the professional skills they need to become more competitive in the current job market, by promoting the development of their personal skills and abilities so that they can fully participate in the world of work and society.

The two basic cornerstones of our methodology are:



TRAINING FOR INCLUSION


The acquisition of theoretical and practical knowledge through "learning by doing" in which the student is actively and dynamically involved right from the start and the need to solve problematic situations is developed in them along with everything else that enables them to participate in society.



EMPLOYMENT WITH SUPPORT

The combination of individualized guidance and support measures in the work place, provided by specialised job coaches who try and make it easier for workers with intellectual disabilities to adapt to society and working in ordinary companies in similar conditions as the other employees assigned with the same type of work.













BUSINESS ADVICE

At the Foundation, we strive for a society in which everyone takes part. Therefore, and in view of the issues concerning the compliance of the LISMI (law requiring companies with more than 50 employees to have a minimum "reserve quota" of 2% with disability), we provide guidance throughout the process as to what the best solution could be for the company, considering its needs.

The Foundation gives advice on how to identify needs, design job positions that companies have to cover and on management and the compliance with alternative measures.

ALTERNATIVE MEASURES

The alternative measures are one of the legally established options (Royal Decree 364/2005), for public and private companies with more than 50 employees that are bound by the 2% reserve quota for employees with disabilities, whereby they can opt for these alternative measures instead in exceptional circumstances.

Collaborating with the Fundación A LA PAR as an alternative measure can involve:

- Buying goods and/or using the services of one of our three Special Employment Centres.
- Making a donation or sponsorship targeting activities related to job placements for people with disabilities.
- Hiring workers with disabilities through a Work Enclave.





Given the nature of our work, the Fundación A LA PAR and its Special Employment Centres can benefit from the alternative measures to hire people with disabilities as established in the Royal Decree 364/2005 dated the 8th of April to comply with the aforesaid (LISMI).



SPECIAL EMPLOYMENT CENTRES

One of the Foundation's primary goals is to help people with intellectual disabilities integrate into society and find a job.

To this end we have three Special Employment Centres: Cadespain, Cademadrid and Las Higueras del Tambor, where we are able to find jobs for some of the users of our Occupational Therapy Centre who have acquired the right skills to do the work required satisfactorily. Currently they employ more than 150 workers. The Special Employment Centres aim to be sustainable and innovative units in their niche markets. Moreover, they are all profitable, not only does this make them sustainable and scalable, but also 100% of their profits are reinvested in the social activities of the Foundation.

The Special Employment Centres of the Fundación A LA PAR are subsidized by the Ministry of the Economy, Employment and Finance of the Community of Madrid.

These three Special Employment Centres are represented through different employment units.

POST OFFICE MAIL SACKS AND STAMPS

We are very proud to say that we have been working with the Spanish Postal Service for more than 20 years. Perhaps through its letters, stamps, postmen and women we have become part of your life too.

MAIL SACKS AND BOXES

A great number of foreign and domestic mail sacks arrive at our Post Office depot every day to be sorted, along with plastic trays to be washed.

The foreign mail sacks are sorted and returned to their country of origin. The domestic mail sacks are also sorted and pressed onto pallets. The cloth sacks are washed and repaired. We also wash and repair mail delivery bags and satchels, the motorcyclists' anoraks and helmets for all mail distribution centres in Spain.

The plastic trays are washed in our industrial tunnel washers and we repair cracked trays too.

The annual figures are clear proof of how efficient our employees' are.

People with intellectual disabilities CAN if they get the necessary support!

- No. of mail sacks classified, washed and repaired: 2,084,880 units.
- No. of washed and disinfected trays: 1,117,882 units.





STAMPS

Every stamp has a story. There are many collections, colours, sizes, and shapes of stamps. At the Fundación A LA PAR, we also have a workshop where various philatelic products are assembled for stamp collectors.

It is complicated and painstaking work in which about 6,000,000 units per year (between the stamps and plate blocks) are handled.

This is very demanding work because there can't be any tears or irregularities in the perforations or stamps.

Since 2015 we have also been in charge of handling 23,000 copies of the Annual Post Office Book, which is a publication that contains all the stamps issued during that year by the Spanish post office, it also features the history of each year. These stamps are placed in custom-made stamp folders, with a written description next to the stamp telling readers about its history and why it is issued.





LA HUERTA DE MONTECARMELO



We have brought the countryside to the city with our urban gardening project. The Huerta de Montecarmelo is ideal for all lovers of gardening, allotments, open spaces and growing crops.

And it is all looked after by individuals with intellectual disabilities, who are trained as horticulturists and gardeners, who look after the 200 allotments that we have made available to the public. This has been a very successful initiative, thanks to the devotion of all our gardeners who tend to the land and keep the area lovely for everyone.



We also look after the gardens around the Foundation, the Tennis and Paddle Tennis Club, and our Quinta de la Muñoza, located in Fl Pardo.

And once a month we organise the Farmers Market that was started so that people could spend a pleasant day in the countryside in the city buying delicious natural produce in the surroundings of the urban gardens.

Homemade products can be found at the market such as: bread, cheese, beer, smoked products, wines and liquors from Madrid, jams and preserves, cold cuts, yoghurts, sweets, organic eggs, gumdrops and jellybeans...





FURNITURE FACTORY

In this workshop, we produce custom-made and socially responsible furniture by hand, we use a long assembly line where each individual contributes to creating trays, end tables, chairs, dressers, and all kinds of furniture.

First, the carpenters prepare the wood; then our industrial painters sand the piece and return it to the carpenters, who apply the finishing touches.



Then the decorative painters apply the colour base coat to decorate, age, and varnish it. It takes special hands to do this painstaking work and give a unique and personal touch to the finished product.

We have a 15 meter, pressurized, dry filter painting booth, which enables us to get perfect finishes.

And we also display our products at major furniture and decoration trade fairs, such as Maison & Objet París, Ambiente in Frankfurt and Intergift in Madrid.





Flower arranging is the main activity of this work unit. Our flower arrangements are created primarily for weddings and events held at our Quinta de la Muñoza and a growing number of companies are relying on us too for their floral decor.

Our employees with intellectual disabilities have come up with an excellent technique to create floral centre pieces and flower arrangements.





CAR REPAIR SHOP

In this workshop we wash cars and we check them over to make sure they are running properly.

First, we clean the inside of the car, vacuum, and wipe down the dashboard; then the car is put through the tunnel washer.

The basic car maintenance done in this garage includes: oil and filter changes, puncture repairs, changing tyres and brake pad replacements.

We also service, clean and do tune-ups on the Foundation's cars and buses.





PRINT SHOP

We specialise in wedding invitations and events, corporate stationery, business cards, reminders, magazines, catalogues, books, pamphlets, leaflets, flyers...

Our employees operate printing tools and machinery; they carry out all types of operations. They are in charge of the page layout, filming, printing, binding, packaging, and distribution.



We have the latest computer equipment, both Mac and PCs, film camera, lightbox, computer-to-plate technology, two offset printer machines, digital printer, paper cutters, folding machine, creasing and riveting machines and staplers be able to do all this work.





CANDY WORKSHOP

This is our sweetest unit, where we make cakes, tartlets, cupcakes, candy brochettes, Christmas trees and any other type of product that can be made with sweets.

The huge success of these products has meant that instead of working solely for individuals now 80% of our business is for companies.

All the employees of this Unit have completed a food handling course to ensure that all products are impeccably presented and meet the strictest standards of quality and hygiene.

Our efforts have been rewarded with clients such as El Corte Inglés, Grupo Vips and Carrefour, who rely on us to be their regular suppliers, with all the requirements that this entails.

In this respect, candy makers such as Oomuombo outsource the handling services of their products to our workers.



HANDICRAFTS AND FASHION ACCESORIES

The creativity, the skills and the search for new opportunities of our teams is non-stop. After sending out a few samples of our work to the heads of companies, we began to make all kinds of fashion accessories for children's clothing: bows, headbands, schrunchies, hairgrips, hairpins, etc.

NEOK & NEOK Y GOOCO are just one example of the companies that have used our services to make their accessory collections of each season.

As well as custom-made handcrafted pieces, another activity of the professionals in this unit is the tableware and decor. The success of this product is basically thanks to the design and the personalization of the pieces (engraving family coats of arms, initials, company logos, fretwork...).






